**GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE**

My Worthy Brother Knights,

On October 17, 2010, Pope Benedict XVI will canonize Brother Andre' of Montreal, Canada who will become the first Canadian-born male saint. Our Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson has compared Brother Andre' dedication to charity in action to that of the Orders founder, Venerable Michael McGivney who also lived in the last 19th century. He has called upon Knights throughout the Order to celebrate Brother Andre' life and virtue and a resolution was adopted by the 128th Supreme Convention in honor of the Canonization of Blessed Andre' Bessette. At the end of this Convention the Supreme Knight announced two important initiatives related to Brother Andre'. The first being a novena that will take place in the days preceding the canonization. From October 9 – 17, the Order will sponsor a novena to Brother Andre', with a newly printed prayer card. The second initiative concerns all First Degree exemplifications; in that all 1st degrees held in the U.S. and Canada from Oct 1 to June 30, 2011 will be held in honor of Brother Andre' and all Candidates will receive a special

certificate. Brother Andy has ordered the new card that will be available for distribution prior to the start of the novena and he will be issuing the new certificate to our Candidates beginning with our First Degree exemplification on October 13.

We are still working out the details regarding our council website change of webmaster, but I know we are getting real close, so stay tuned and I will give you the information as we resolve the final issues. Our Deputy Grand Knight / Program Director, Brother Khai Phan still needs a Special Programs Directors. We still have an opening for a Council Director. Our thanks go out to Brother Gilles Devictor who accepted the position of Director of Family Programs. #### **CULTURE OF LIFE REPORT**

##### ***40 Days for Life program (in progress)***

It is not too late for us Knights to join in the 40 Days for Life program, even though it started on Wed., Sept. 22nd. The program will continue through the end of October. Our community, including the Knights, will be one of many from coast to coast joining together for the most dynamic coordinated pro-life mobilization in history.

40 Days for Life is a focused pro-life effort that consists of 1) prayer & fasting (as you can begin by personal Lent-like commitments), 2) peaceful vigils (to witness outside of Planned Parenthood facilities), 3) community outreach (spread information via media, advocacy, and public visibility.) At the same time, the Knights of Columbus is rolling out a new National Prayer for Life Campaign (NPLC) ([www.nationalprayerforlife.org](http://www.nationalprayerforlife.org)).

For our parish, I plan weekly reminders in the church bulletin and the culture of life intention at all 9:30 am Sunday Masses in October. The KofC program NPLC prayer cards will be distributed October 2nd & 3rd. Our Council will be concentrating on #1 (prayer & fasting) and #3 (outreach information). However, you may support #2 (peaceful vigils at Planned Parenthood) as you wish and can. There are 27 vigil locations in CA. San Jose, Tues, 28 Sept (completed). See the events below.

Also, I am receiving a daily program as the venue crosses the country. Let me know if you wish to receive this daily program, including a devotional, via email. The devotional contains an intention, a short scripture, reflection (by Fr. Pavone), and prayer. Programme, 6:30 to 8:00 PM. Venue: The Portuguese Athletic Club, 1401 E. Santa Clara Street San Jose, CA 95116 (Beside the Five Wounds Portuguese National Parish)

I believe that we are all well aware of the urgent need for such pro-life efforts with Supreme's response! While this 40 Days for Life program concentrates on the abortion issue, we should also include concerns on the other end of life (e.g. euthanasia) as well as our modern culture of disrespect for life for those years in between! ### **DISTRICT DEPUTY REPORT**

I was surprised at how quiet September became. There were not a lot of actions required of the District Deputy during the month. However, I did see quite a bit of communications from both the Supreme and the State Councils. Most of the communications were also addressed to all Grand Knights, so the GKs will pass along the information either in their review of communications or as a part of the Grand Knight report during business meetings.

During September, most of the Councils geared up for recruiting and have conducted or are planning to conduct a recruiting drive. I encourage all Councils to stay with it, to follow up and contact those prospects you met at the drives. An Open House night can go a long way to getting a prospects signature on the Form 100. Consider inviting the prospects family to get a glimpse of what your Council is. Include your Field Agent in the Open House. He has a prepared presentation that is an excellent summation of the Knights of Columbus. Most FAs do not make a sales pitch about the insurance, rather the focus on the benefits to the family that the Order has other than just the fraternal insurance.

Every Council is preparing for the annual People with Intellectual Disabilities campaign in October. Some Councils are planning Tootsie Roll hand-outs, and others are doing additional activities such as car washes to raise contributions. There are a lot of suggestions in the materials that the each Council receives and are provided to your PWID chairman. Be creative but go with what is or has been successful in your parishes in the past.

PWID contributions can come in to your Council throughout the remainder of the year. Some Councils continue seeking donations through collections at Masses, or contribution bottles placed in local stores. Whatever your Council does to extend the donations, please ensure that your Council follows the protocols for monies collected from the public. Most of us have been involved with the PWID for years, and many of us have tried our level best to comply with the fiscal rules. As I listened to all the guidance and discussions, it seems to be simple. Once you have a sum of collections, there will be cash and checks. Take the cash to your bank and get a cashier's check for the amount. Yes, there may be a fee the bank charges for it, and that can be either a Council expense or you can list it as an expense of the PWID on the summary form. Take the cashier's check and all the other checks and send them to Columbian Charities. The key here is that the Council does not endorse the checks. Endorsing the checks is the equivalent of commingling funds and it removes them from the charitable contribution category. Our Councils are 501.c.3 entities, and contributions to them are not deductible by the donor. Columbian Charities is a 501.c.8, and contributions to them are deductible.

Please contact Brother Bill Glover or me if there are any questions about how to handle the funds you collect. Also remember that you can send collected funds to Columbian Charities throughout the year. Do not hold them for any length of time.

One item of concern has been a lack of response to Councils when Columbian Charities receives the funds. If you share this concern I recommend the use of a return receipt when you mail the funds to them. Until we implement either a direct deposit or deposit-on-line scheme, this will ensure Councils have documentation for their records.

Good luck on a successful PWID campaign.
